

Monroe High School has a full-time high school guidance and college counselor.

Monroe High School has a full-time special education teacher and two full-time special education instructional assistants.

Class sizes are small with an average of sixteen students per class.

Our block schedule includes a daily 45-minute advisory period which enables students to receive individual help and instruction across the curriculum.

Our Student Services Team (SST) meets weekly to develop strategic and focused interventions to assist students in being successful in high school.
