Definitions:

- “Units of Credit” are defined by the State of Oregon as “certification of a student’s successful completion of classroom or equivalent work (e.g. independent study, work experience, research) in a course of at least 130 clock hours.”
- Credits will be issued and recorded on permanent records for each 0.5 unit of credit upon receipt of a “D” grade or higher.

Diploma Tracks and Options

1.Standard Track:

- ✓Eight semesters of appropriate attendance.
- ✓Completion of 24 acceptable units of credit.
- ✓Meets all essential skill and personalized learning requirements. (See graduation requirements)

2.College Prep Track:

- ✓Eight semesters of appropriate attendance.
- ✓Completion of 28 acceptable units of credit.
- ✓No Pass/Fail credits.
- ✓3.0 accumulated GPA
- ✓Meets all essential skill and personalized learning requirements as well as completing the following:

- ✓**Language Arts** **4 credits**
- ✓**Mathematics** **4 credits**
- ✓**Science** **4 credits**
to include two of the following options:
Chemistry, Physics, Anatomy and Physiology
- ✓**Social Studies** **3 credits**
- ✓**Second Language** **2 credits**
both in the same language of study
- ✓**Health Education** **1 credit**
- ✓**Physical Education** **1 credit**
- ✓**Career Education** **½ credit**
- ✓**Personal Finance** **½ credit**

3.Standard Diploma:

- ✓Eight semesters of appropriate attendance.
- ✓Completion of “College Prep Track” requirements.
- ✓Meets all essential skills and local requirements.
- ✓3.5 accumulative GPA or above

All OPU institutions require two years of same high school-level second language with a grade of C- or better, or two terms of a college-level second language with a grade of C- or better, or acceptable performance on proficiency-assessment options.

3. Admission to Private College/University:
Minimum requirements for high school coursework: 4 years of English, 4 years of math, 2-4 years of foreign language, 3-4 years of social science and 3-4 years of natural science.

**If you are looking at private colleges you need to start planning at the beginning of your high school career regarding the selection of your courses.*

4. Apprenticeships: Offers the opportunity to receive on the job training after high school. Examples of trade/apprenticeship programs would be: Electrician, Construction Trades, Industrial Mechanic/Maintenance, Millwright, and Plumber.
