

Notification of Board Meetings

The Board will give public notice reasonably calculated to give actual notice to interested persons, including those with disabilities, or the time and place for regular meetings and of the principal subjects to be considered.

If only an executive session will be held, the notice will state the specific provisions of the law authorizing the executive session.

No special meeting will be held without at least 24 hours notice to the Board members and the general public except in the case of emergency.

In the case of emergency, a meeting may be held upon such notice as is appropriate under the circumstances, but minutes will explain the emergency situation.

Date of regular meetings of the Board will be provided to district employees, interested members of the public, and the news media.

With the above notices, it takes a quorum or a majority of the Board with an affirmative vote of three members to transact any business. A lesser number may meet and adjourn from time to time and compel the presence of absent members for official transaction of business.
