

Video Surveillance

The Board authorizes the use of video cameras on district property to ensure the health, welfare and safety of all staff, students and visitors to district property, and to safeguard district facilities and equipment. Video cameras may be used in locations as deemed appropriate by the superintendent.

The district shall notify staff and students that video surveillance may occur on district property.

Persons who are observed to be engaged in conduct that reasonably appears to constitute a violation of the law, or of board policy, administrative regulations or building rules, may be referred to the appropriate law enforcement agency. Students and staff who are observed to be engaged in such conduct shall also be subject to appropriate disciplinary action.

Video recordings of conduct by a student that constitutes a violation of the law, or of board policy, administrative regulations or building rules may be made a part of the student's education record. Video recordings of conduct by a staff member that constitutes a violation of the law, or of board policy, administrative regulations or building rules may be made a part of the staff members personnel record. The district shall comply with all applicable state and federal laws relating to the maintenance and retention of records.
