







State Goals

To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.







About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Monroe High School strives to provide advanced coursework in a variety of areas: Career Education, Personal Finance, and Senior Project courses required for graduation Spanish 1-2 offered in the classroom while building a cohort for advanced Spanish College-prep and Honors Diploma programs offered

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Monroe High School offers a number of career-oriented technical (CTE) courses. For the 2018-19 school year, we have continued to restructure our Computers program and now offer Computer Applications, Desktop Publishing, and Graphic Arts courses which are articulated with Linn-Benton Community College for dual credit. In our Industrial Arts department, Welding 1-4, Woodworking 1-4, Fundamentals of Engineering, and Principles of Technology (Electric Car Program) are offered. Many of these courses are articulated with our Perkins CTE program and dual credits can be earned through Lane Community College.
