Get more fruits and vegetables when you spend your Oregon Trail Card SNAP dollars at participating farmer's markets. It's easy with <u>Double Up Food Bucks</u>! For example, if you spend \$20 of your SNAP dollars at a participating farmer's market, you get another \$20 to buy more locally grown fruits and vegetables. At farmers markets, the Double Up Food Bucks benefit comes in the form of \$2 coupons that can be redeemed for fresh fruits and vegetables at any participating farmer's market in Oregon! HOW IT WORKS

 Double Up Food Bucks doubles your money, up to \$20 a day, for every SNAP dollar spent at the farmers market. That's up to \$20 FREE to spend on fresh, locally grown produce.

- Double Up Food Bucks come in \$2 increments.
- No change can be given for Double Up Food Bucks.
- Double Up Food Bucks expire Dec 31 each year.
- Double Up Food Bucks can be used at 70+ locations across Oregon from May to October.




